Specific aims of the department, along with learning and socialization goals:

The purpose of the history course is to enable students to realize that the world in which they live have been influenced by past events and to understand the present by approaching it from an historical perspective. Students are encouraged to seek information and to interpret social phenomena as a way to understand the world and the impact human actions have upon it. We strive to instill a sense of open-minded, social participation by preparing the students to be well-informed citizens in a democratic society. We contemplate the past, use chronological reference points, analyze historical data, research, organize and communicate our results.

In the Social Studies Program, History is taught in Sec 2. The cycle consists of two parts: year 1 and year 2. Since the topics follow a chronological order, the topics pertaining to year 1 are taught during the first half of the year and are evaluated on the **first and second Term Report Card**. The topics pertaining to year 2 are taught during the second half of the year and are evaluated on the **second and third Term Report Card**.
